




# Adopt-A-Street Program Summer 2024


# **Abandoned Shopping Cart Retrieval Program**



## **Background**

## 3,080 Retrieved Carts

**April 2023-March 2024** 



## Responsibility of Retailers



- Retrieval of their store's abandoned shopping carts.
- Provide shopping cart containment areas.
- Carts located outside of containment area are considered a public nuisance.
- Signage on each cart, stating that unauthorized removal of shopping cart constitutes theft.

# Code Compliance Outreach to Retailers

- Many have existing cart containment or retrieval systems.
- Improvement needed on required signage.
- Retailers continue to review cart containment technology.



## **Exploration of Cost Recovery**

# Required Code Changes

- Clarity on labeling requirements for retailers
- Establish fees sufficient to cover costs

## Additional Administration

 Resources to process notice violations to prepare and prove enforcement cases and administer collections

## **Next Steps**



 Renewal of cart retrieval vendor contract

 Continue to work with retailers on signage, containment and retrieval



- ✓ Record

### Follow the 3 R's

### REPORT

Reporting graffiti is an important step in preventing and addressing the problem.

- Call 911 to report graffiti in progress.
- Use the MyBellevue app or the Bellevuewa.gov website to report existing graffiti.
- If you need to file a police report for existing graffiti, this can be done online at <u>bellevuewa.gov/report-and-prevent-crime</u> or by calling the non-emergency line 425-577-5656.

### **RECORD**

Take a photograph of the graffiti. This record of the vandalism can be important to include in a police report or in your report on the MyBellevue app or city website.

#### **REMOVE**

Remove the graffiti from your property within 24-48 hours to help prevent graffiti from spreading or reoccurring. Quick removal of graffiti is considered one of the best ways to combat graffiti.

Graffiti that is not removed may result in code enforcement action.


