Whereas: Black-owned businesses are essential to flourishing communities and culture

as they support families and provide careers within the Bellevue community;

and

Whereas: Throughout history, despite facing systemic racism, redlining and even

extreme violence, Black businesses continue to grow and thrive throughout

the nation; and

Whereas: Black-owned businesses serve as a representation of perseverance and

success, often play an active role in community development and reinvestment, and can have a significant impact on social and political

change; and

Whereas: Bellevue's Black-owned businesses play an important role in spurring

economic development by providing access to wealth-building resources

for current and future generations of Black families; and
