RE: American Public Works Association 2015 Project of the Year Award

Bellevue Utilities has been honored with the 2015 Project of the Year Award by the Washington State American Public Works Association for the Coal Creek Parkway Culvert/Bridge Project.

Details on the award, which was announced in March, include:

- Bellevue Utilities competed for the honor with six other agencies.
- The award recognizes excellence in management and administration in the successful completion of public works projects.
- Bellevue was recognized under the Environment Category, for projects less than \$5 million.

Many added benefits to the community – in addition to safely transporting 28,000 vehicles daily – resulted from the new 39-foot bridge and culvert replacement:

- Hikers and walkers can now easily cross under the roadway on a pedestrian walkway and connect with Coal Creek Trail.
- Salmon now have almost one mile of improved habitat that was previously restricted.

The project also exemplifies the city's One City philosophy – Utilities, Parks and Transportation all worked together – creating examples of excellence:

- Parks offered design ideas and funding for the new pedestrian walkway.
- Transportation helped coordinate lane closures and responded to residents' calls.

The complexity of the project also deserves attention. Some of the challenges, included:

- Relocation of vital infrastructure fiber optic cables, a 12-inch PSE gas line and two large Olympic petroleum pipelines.
- The bridge had to be built in two stages one half at a time to keep traffic lanes open and safely move the pipelines.

Despite the challenges, the project was completed on schedule and under budget.
