2.	Locations for new electrical facilities Councilmember Robertson suggested consideration of two new policies related to the siting of aerial electrical and telecommunication facilities. One would discourage development of new corridors while the other would support use of the street right-of-way. On June 22, Councilmembers debated the consequences of these two proposed policies and directed that they come back for discussion by the full Council.	Proposed amendment on p. 152:  UT-X27 Discourage new aerial facilities  within corridors that have no existing aerial facilities, unless no feasible alternative exists.  UT-X28 Encourage new transmission facilities to be located in street rights-of-way.
