- *Whereas:* On average, 700 people die each year in boating-related accidents in the U.S., the vast majority caused by human error or poor judgment; and
- *Whereas:* Today's life jackets are more comfortable, more attractive, and more wearable than styles of years past and deserve a fresh look from today's boating public; and
- *Whereas:* The Bellevue Sail and Power Squadron and the United States Coast Guard Auxiliary Flotilla 22 share the mission of promoting and improving recreational boating safety by teaching safety courses and conducting vessel safety checks.
 - *Now, therefore, I,* John Stokes, Mayor of the City of Bellevue, Washington, on behalf of the City Council, do hereby proclaim the week of **May 21-27, 2016** as:
