DISCUSSION/ACTION ITEMS

Cascade Water Alliance Proposed 2019-2020 Budget and Rates: Cascade Water Alliance (Cascade) Chief Executive Officer, Chuck Clarke, will present Cascade's proposed budget and rates for 2019 and 2020. No formal action is required by Council. Tonight's briefing is an opportunity for Council to ask questions and provide feedback and direction to staff. The Cascade Water Alliance Board of Directors is scheduled to take action on the proposed budget and rates in late September.

Draft Smart Mobility Interest Statement: Council has endorsed the Bellevue Smart plan that covers smart city strategies and implementation actions to achieve improved livability, sustainability and resiliency in a world that is increasingly digital, mobile, connected and urban. Transportation is one of six elements in the Bellevue Smart plan, and Bellevue's Smart Mobility Plan represents the implementation strategy for the transportation element. At the June 18 Study Session, Council discussed principles and interests on this topic and directed staff to draft a Smart Mobility Interest Statement. No formal action is required tonight by Council. Tonight's discussion will provide Council an opportunity to review the draft Interest Statement and provide feedback and direction to staff. Based on Council direction, action to adopt the Interest Statement will be requested at a future meeting.

State Legislative Session Update: Staff has provided a written update on recent activities during the interim at the state level regarding Bellevue's interests and priorities.

Federal Legislative Update: Staff has provided a written update on recent activities at the federal level covering Congress and the Administration.
