

CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON

ORDINANCE NO. 6422

AN ORDINANCE amending the 2017-2018 Operating Grants and Donations Fund adopted on November 27, 2017, as previously amended, to increase the appropriation by \$169,307 and authorizing acceptance of King County Emergency Medical Services (KCEMS) funds from the Department of Public Health (PHSKC), in the amount of \$169,307 to continue the CARES1 Response Unit; establishing a project within the Operating Grants and Donations Fund; appropriating unanticipated and future revenues to that fund; and authorizing the expenditure of said grant funds.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City Manager or his designee is authorized to accept the King County Emergency Medical Services (KCEMS) funds from the Department of Public Health (PHSKC), in the amount of \$169,307 to continue the CARES1 Response Unit, a copy of which agreement is given Clerk's Receiving No. _____.

Section 2. The City's 2017-2018 Operating Grants and Donations Fund adopted by Ordinance No. 6389 on November 27, 2017, as previously amended, is hereby further amended to increase its appropriation for by \$169,307 due to increased funds received from the King County Emergency Medical Services (KCEMS) Funds from the Department of Public Health (PHSKC) to continue the CARES1 Response Unit.

Provided, however, if the actual revenue received from the anticipated source should be more or less than the amount set forth herein, the appropriations shall be adjusted to equal the amount actually received.

Section 3. At the time of acceptance of said funds, a project shall be established within the Operating Grants, Donations and Special Reserve Fund into which all said monies shall be deposited.

Section 4. The appropriate administrative officials of the City shall have responsibility for the administration of said funds and shall have all authority necessary or appropriate to expend funds as authorized herein.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after its passage and legal publication.
