Fireworks will illuminate the skies over Bellevue's Downtown Park this July 4th as part of the 27th annual Bellevue Family 4th of July Celebration. This free family event continues to be the Eastside's largest Independence Day celebration, with an estimated viewing attendance of 60,000.

We invite Mayor Chelminiak and City Councilmembers to join the community at this popular event that showcases our wonderful Downtown Park and provides a convenient and beautiful gathering space in the heart of downtown Bellevue.

The Family Fun Zone that provides a variety of inflatable bounce-type rides will be enhanced by the addition of the new Family Plaza that will offer free entertainment, art activity booths, non-food vendors, and mascots for families to enjoy. The popular food court area will offer a variety of food choices from the southwest parking lot near the new Inspiration Playground.

The PACCAR Main Stage will offer quality entertainment from 3:40pm to 10:40pm and will include:
