DISCUSSION/ACTION ITEMS

There are no formal presentations planned for tonight's meeting. Staff has provided written updates on the customary regional, state and federal government committees, issues and activities. In addition, staff will provide information tonight on the local impacts of the federal government shutdown and a summary of some of the key issues and topics that will be brought to Council in 2019.

Some of these issues and topics will require Council discussion and potential action to adopt policy positions on behalf of the City (e.g., King County Parks Levy renewal, Emergency Management Services Levy renewal, the King County Solid Waste Comprehensive Plan, follow up on the State Transportation Commission's road usage charge pilot project, among others). 2019 promises to be packed with issues of interest to the City in achieving the Council's vision and priorities.
