## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

This motion will award Bid No. 18122 to Award Construction to install on-street buffered, and non-buffered, bike lanes to protect and separate bicyclists from vehicular traffic on Eastgate Way between SE Richards Road and SE 35<sup>th</sup> Place.

# RECOMMENDATION

Move to award Bid No. 18122, Eastgate Way Non-Motorized Access to Transit (CIP Plan Nos. PW-R-199 and PW-W/B-56) to Award Construction.

If approved, effective date: 02/11/2019.

### **BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS**

In November 2016, residents of Bellevue approved the Neighborhood Safety and Connectivity Levy (CIP Plan No. PW-R-199) to fund six focus areas including congestion relief, safety, sidewalks, bicycle facilities, intelligent transportation systems, and maintenance. This program addresses Council's desire to address a backlog of projects, including new sidewalk facilities and safety improvements.

On February 5, 2018, Council authorized the execution of a grant agreement (Ordinance No. 6399) with the Washington State Department of Transportation to accept up to \$667,111 in federal Congestion Mitigation & Air Quality (CMAQ) grant funding to support construction of non-motorized roadway improvements on Eastgate Way. The grant amount was subsequently increased by \$19,063, for a revised total of \$686,174, due to a reallocation of funds from King County Metro to the City's Eastgate Way Non-Motorized Access to Transit project.

On December 3, 2018, Council adopted the 2019-2025 Capital Investment Program (CIP) (Ordinance No. 6445) that included the Neighborhood Sidewalks Program (CIP Plan No. PW-W/B-56).

The project will restripe Eastgate Way between Richards Road and SE 35<sup>th</sup> Place with on-street buffered, and non-buffered, bike lanes to protect and separate bicyclists from vehicular traffic. The 2009 Pedestrian and Bicycle Plan identified bike lanes on Eastgate Way as a high priority. The 2016 Bicycle Rapid Implementation Plan update also identified Eastgate Way as a priority corridor for rapid implementation of bicycle facilities.

<sup>\*</sup>The low bidder, R.W. Scott Construction, claimed a bidder error and requested their bid be withdrawn from consideration. City staff reviewed the request and agreed to allow the bid to be withdrawn and award the project to the second low bidder.

To the best of our knowledge and professional judgment, all factors that typically contribute to construction expenses have been accounted for in the Plans, Specifications and Estimate. Based on our experience, projects of this type may result in some field changes. All claims are rigorously reviewed and only those that are clearly necessary to accomplish the intent of the contract, but have not previously been provided for, will be paid.

### **Policy Impact**

# **Fiscal Impact**

Awarding this bid will obligate the City to \$842,614, plus all applicable taxes, to install bike lanes on Eastgate Way between Richards Road and SE 35<sup>th</sup> Place. This amount is approximately 15 percent under the Engineer's Estimate. Sufficient funding exists in the 2019-2025 CIP (CIP Plan Nos. PW-R-199 and PW-W/B-56) to fully fund this contract as follows:
