SUBJECT: Regional Issues Overview

DISCUSSION/ACTION ITEMS

King County Solid Waste Comprehensive Plan: King County Solid Waste Division Director Pat McLaughlin will provide an overview of the proposed King County 2019 Comprehensive Solid Waste Management Plan (Plan). The Plan outlines goals and policies for managing solid waste in King County over the next six years, including recommendations on potential future disposal methods, new transfer facilities, and recycling goals. The Plan was transmitted to the King County Council in July and is under review by the Regional Policy Committee (RPC) and the King County Committee of the Whole (COW).

The RPC is scheduled to take action to refer the Plan to the County Council at its February 27 meeting. The COW is scheduled to begin its review March 6. Once the COW has finished its review, the County Council will take action on the Plan. Following County Council adoption of the Plan, cities within the King County solid waste system, including Bellevue, will be asked to consider adoption of the Plan during a 120-day review period. Tonight's presentation is an opportunity for Council to ask questions and provide feedback and/or direction to Councilmember John Stokes, who serves on the RPC, and King County and Bellevue staff.
