

City of Bellevue Proclamation

- Sexual Assault Awareness Month calls attention to the fact that sexual violence is Whereas: widespread and impacts many individuals in our community; and
- Whereas: In Washington state, 45% of women and 22% of men report having experienced sexual violence in their lifetime; and
- Whereas: In King County, 7,300 adults and children received specialized assistance from organizations with programming for sexual assault victims in 2018; and
- Whereas: Demand for services at the King County Sexual Assault Resource Center jumped 19% last year; and
- Of the 4,888 individuals served by the King County Sexual Assault Resource Center Whereas: in 2018, half were children; and
- Whereas: Negative impacts of sexual violence trauma on women, men, children and youth include fear, concern for safety, symptoms of post-traumatic stress disorder, injury, and missed work or school; and
- Working together to educate our community about sexual violence, supporting Whereas: survivors when they come forward, speaking out against harmful attitudes and actions, and engaging in best-practice sexual violence prevention, we can help end sexual violence in our community.
 - Now, therefore, I, John Chelminiak, Mayor of the City of Bellevue, Washington, and on behalf of its City Council, do hereby proclaim the month of April 2019 as:

SEXUAL ASSAULT AWARENESS MONTH

and ask all residents to commit to a safer future, through education and prevention, for all children, young adults, and families in Bellevue.
