

CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON

ORDINANCE NO. 6471

AN ORDINANCE amending Ordinance 6445, adopted December 3, 2018, as previously amended, to increase appropriation to the 2019-2020 Human Services Fund budget by \$585,630 for Congregations for the Homeless (“CFH”) to provide funding for operational expenses for shelter services at a downtown “bridge” location for men experiencing homelessness, and to provide additional operating funding for Lincoln Center to provide day center services and shelter services and authorizing the City Manager or his designee to enter into such a contract.

WHEREAS, by Ordinance No. 6445 adopted on December 3, 2018, the City Council adopted a fiscal biennium budget for 2019-2020 for the Human Services Fund; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to further amend the 2019-2020 biennium budget for the Human Services Fund to provide for the addition of funds for CFH to provide funding for operational expenses for a downtown “bridge” location for men experiencing homelessness while tenant improvements are made to Lincoln Center, and for the operational funding to eliminate the service gap,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Ordinance 6445, adopted on December 3, 2018, as previously amended, is hereby further amended to increase the appropriation to the 2019-2020 Human Services Fund by \$585,630, as transferred from the General Fund.

Section 2. The City Manager or his designee is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with CFH to provide funding for operational expenses for shelter services at a downtown “bridge” location for men experiencing homelessness, to provide additional operating funding for Lincoln Center to provide day center services, and to provide shelter services at Lincoln Center to eliminate the service gap.

Section 3. The appropriate administrative officials of the City are hereby authorized to receive the monies anticipated herein and to expend the same for the purposes set forth herein.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after its passage and legal publication.
