## **Background**

- July 23, 2018
  - Evaluate feasibility for year-round men's shelter
  - Lincoln Center, or another interim location
  - Assist CFH (path for code compliance, funding opportunities, applications)
  - Develop collaborative schedule: year-round end 2019
- November 5, 2018
  - Presented Feasibility Study
  - Authorized expenditure of \$135,000 for additional testing and design advancement

## **Since November**

- Working with CFH and community partners
- Advanced design for building modifications
- Permit submittal plans preparation/coordination
- Continued discussion with community partners
  - Timing and phasing of modifications
  - Cost/contributions to complete work

Minimal additional city funds have been expended

## Modify Building for Interim Year-Round Overnight Shelter Use: Land Use Process

- Temporary Public Safety Facility (LUC 20.20.850)
- City Manager declaration of emergency
- Application for approval of Temporary Public Safety Facility (exempt from other land use processes)
- Maximum of 3 years (2-years with an allowance for one-year extension)
- Timing depends upon date when Lincoln Center commences year-round shelter services

## **Public Engagement Plan**

- Inform community of potential changes
- Gather feedback on communication essentials for shelter services
- CFH address concerns in their communication plan
- Engagement Plan:
  - Notification to properties within 1000 feet
  - Web, listserv/email notifications
  - News release, Facebook and Nextdoor Notifications
  - COB/BPD coordinate engagement with CFH
  - CFH continued engagement and discussion with surrounding businesses

## Performance of Construction

Both options: plans prepared by CFH Team to obtain permits

#### **Managed by CFH**


- Privately funded tenant improvement
- Fully funded and managed by CFH Team
- Early demolition work could begin as early as mid-April
- Construction could be complete mid to late November 2019

#### **Managed by City**

- City manages public procurement process
- City contracts for building modifications
- Construction estimated \$900,000-\$1,200,000
- Potential private contributions toward public work
- Construction could be complete mid to late February 2020

## **Direction Needed**

- Performance of construction
  - Continue working with CFH team and return April 1<sup>st</sup>
- Shelter services gap (tonight)
- Operational funding (tonight)

## **Shelter Services Gap**

#### **Council Feedback Requested:**

- Should staff pursue additional location for gap in services during construction, and;
- Begin additional public engagement
- Considerations
  - Potentially new neighborhood
  - Possible capital investment
  - Lease terms
  - Similar Land Use Process
    - Declaration of emergency
    - Application for Temporary Public Safety Facility
    - Maximum of 3 years



## **Additional Operational Funding Need**

Gap in Operational Expenses for Year-Round (per year)

Year-round emergency shelter operations \$385,000

Extend Day Center operations \$185,000

**Total Annual Operational Expenses** \$570,000

## **Additional Operational Funding**

- 2019 and 2020 need
- 2021-2022 Human Services funding request
- Working with regional partners
  - Additional homeless services needs
  - Timing of CFH funding need

## **Additional Operational Funding**

#### **Council Feedback Requested:**

- 2019 funding (only w/alternative summer location)
  - \$385,000 shelter operational gap
  - \$185,000 Day Center gap
- 2020 funding
  - \$385,000 shelter operational gap
  - \$185,000 Day Center gap
