Background

- Guide the recommendations of the Human Services Commission for allocation of 2019-2020 Human Services Fund (approximately \$3.2 million annually)
- Direct the work of Human Services Division
- Provide information for community groups and regional planning

Value of current investments

Prevent homelessness

 Keep children safe and engaged while their parents work


 Decrease social isolation for older adults

Methodology

- Phone/online survey
- Community conversations
- Provider surveys
- Consumer surveys

Affordable Housing:

- In 2017, 77% of phone and online survey respondents rated lack of affordable housing as the number one community problem.
- •Almost one in three (31%) of Bellevue renters are cost burdened.
- One in six (16%) are severely cost burdened.




Percentage of Residents Rating Affordable Housing a Major or Moderate Problem

•Homelessness:

- Bellevue School District: homeless students steadily increased from 58 in 2006-07 to 257 in 2016-17.
- In 2016-17, the Eastside winter shelters served:
 - Men: 429 men
 - ■Women: 192 women
 - ■Families: 137 adults and 182 children

•Racial and Ethnic Inclusion:

- Phone/online survey: 24% rated racial or ethnic discrimination as a major or moderate community problem.
- Teachers, service providers and first responders: more concern in the community about immigration issues.

- •Mental health issues and substance use disorder:
 - ■2016:15% of 8th graders, 17% of 10th graders, and 16% of 12th graders in the Bellevue School District had contemplated suicide.
 - •Increase in adults and youth with substance use issues (opioids and heroin.)

- •Access to transportation options:
 - ■2017 Provider's survey: 70% reported that their clients needed, but couldn't find, help with transportation
 - •Almost a quarter of residents: lack of public transportation is the top household problem.

Next Steps

- Funding application process begins mid-March
- Applications due in mid-April
- Recommendations will be brought by the Commission to the City Council Fall 2018
