History - NE 12th Street Multipurpose Path Project


Project Planning Phases:

- 1993 Bike project identified in the first Pedestrian and Bicycle Transportation Plan
- 2009 updated Pedestrian and Bicycle Plan Eastrail (ERC) (Downtown - Overlake Connection) between BelRed and Bellevue Way – connecting described 12'-14' off-street path on north side of street
- 2013 included in the Downtown Transportation Plan
- 2018 108th Avenue NE Bicycle Corridor

Project Description:

- Expands the current 3' planter strip and 5' sidewalk to a 5' planter strip and 12' multipurpose path on the north side of NE 12th Street
- Sufficient right-of-way not available on the south side
- 12' is minimum WSDOT design standard for a multipurpose Path


Typical Section Looking East:




Plan View (west to east):

Plan View NE 12th Street at 112th Avenue:



- Safely separates people riding bicycles and walking from traffic
- Connects the BelRed area and Eastrail to Downtown and the 108th Avenue NE bike lanes
- Installs a segment of a long-planned continuous and connected and comfortable path that will link Downtown and BelRed/Spring District
