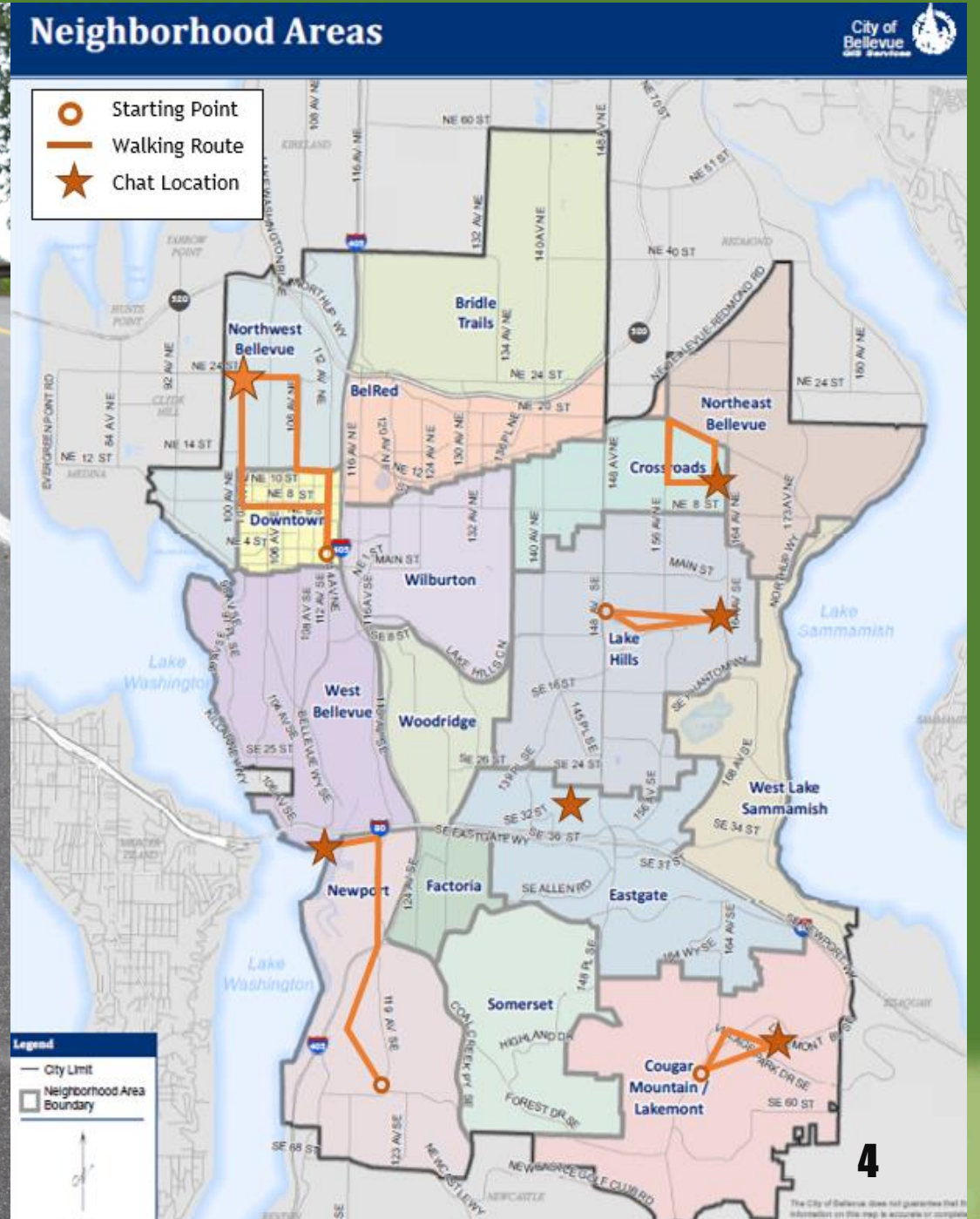

Where we walked



Downtown/Northwest



- The changing mix of homes
- Increasing “cut-through” traffic
- Chapin Trail and walkability

Lake Hills



- Pride in neighborhood's diversity, connectivity and natural beauty
- Two houses of concern are being monitored by Code Compliance staff
- Desire for a crosswalk with signal at Lake Hills Blvd and 156th Ave

Crossroads/Northeast



- Crossroads Trail and 2019 Transportation project
- Request for crosswalk signaling at Northup Way and 160th Ave

Crossroads/Northeast



- Concern about habitat impact with loss of trees in the area
- Role of Bellevue Technology Center as natural buffer from development activity on 156th

Newport



- More meetings in the community, rather than at City Hall
- Mini City Hall in Factoria or Newport Hills
- 119th Street Bike Lane

Bellevue College area



- Homelessness and location of men's shelter
- Kamber Rd. and SE 24th crosswalk
- There is a desire for wayfinding for public access

Lewis Creek Area



- Residents remember when area was 3 farms
- Gathering spot for Mandarin-speaking seniors
- Great place for education and engagement with small children
