

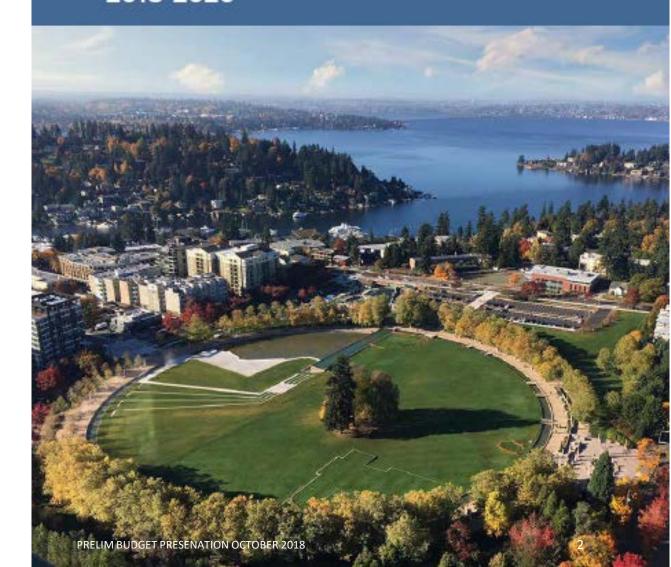

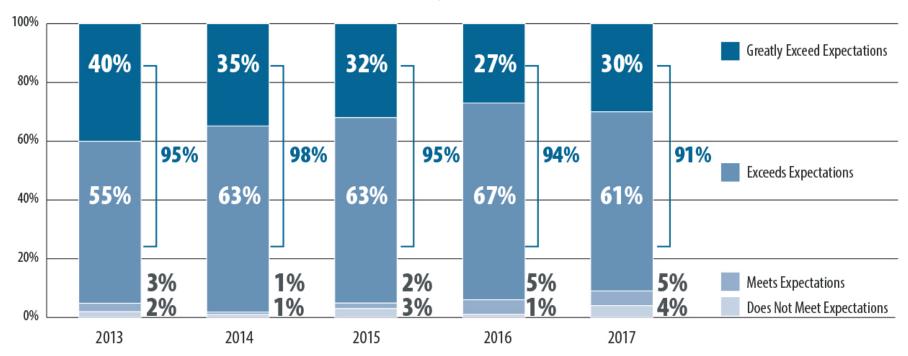


City Council Vision Priorities 2018-2020

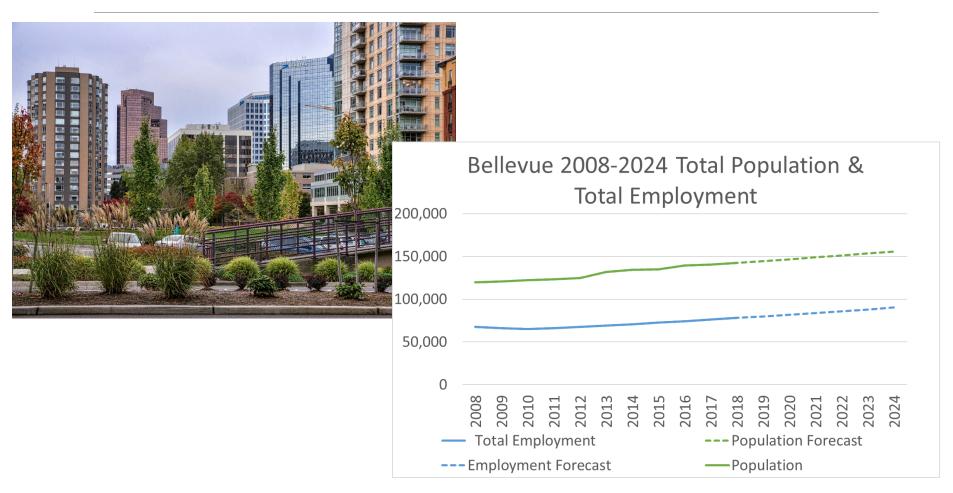




Performance Survey Results Overall Quality of Life in Bellevue









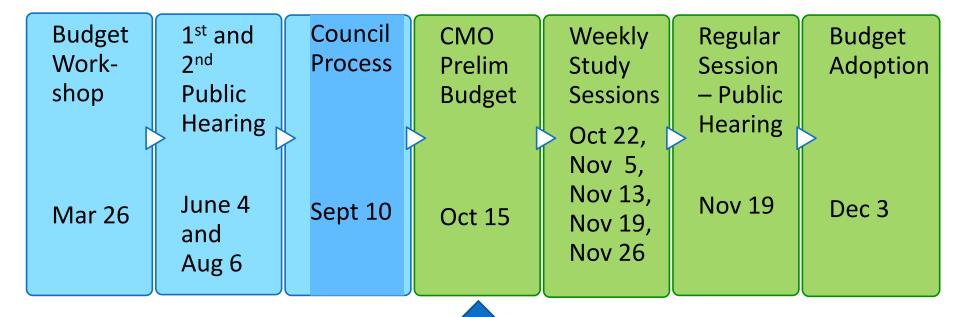

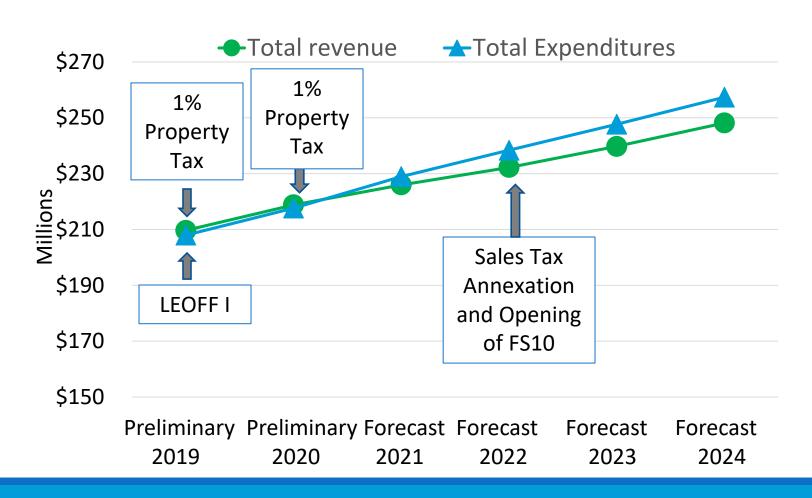
March 26 Workshop – General Fund

 Revenues were forecasted to exceed expenditures in the near term, yet by mid-term, the reverse occurs

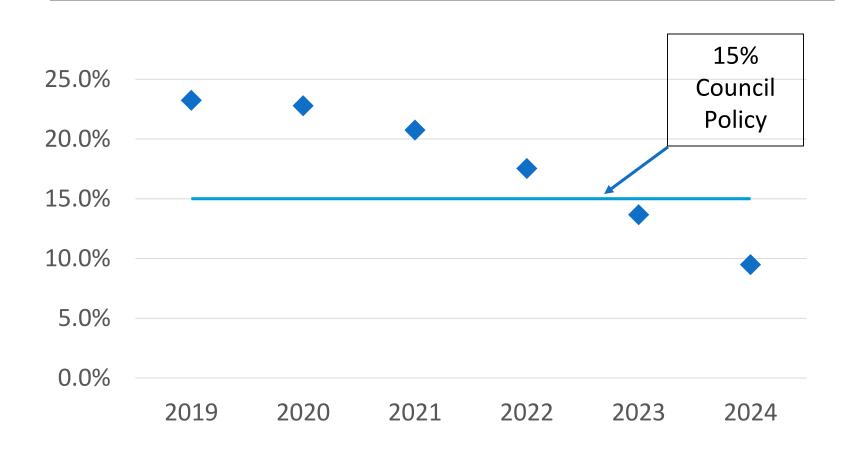


General Fund Forecast





Ending Fund Balance

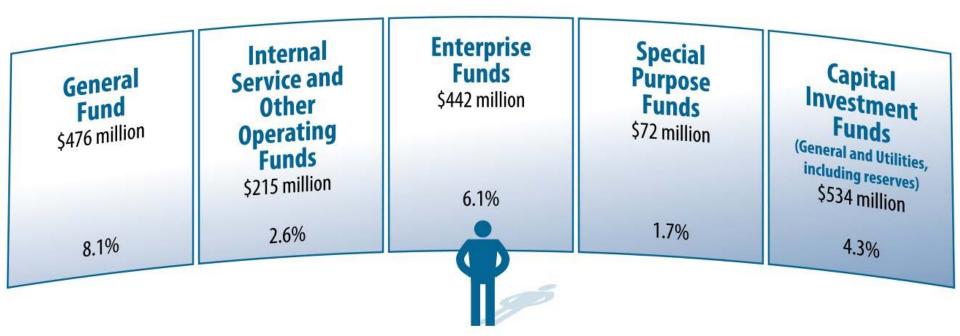




2019-2020 TOTAL CITY BUDGET OVERVIEW



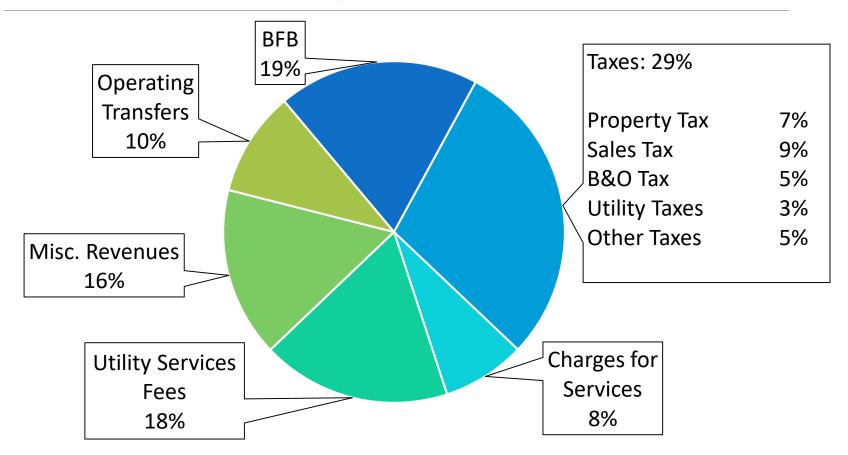
Total Budget \$1.7B

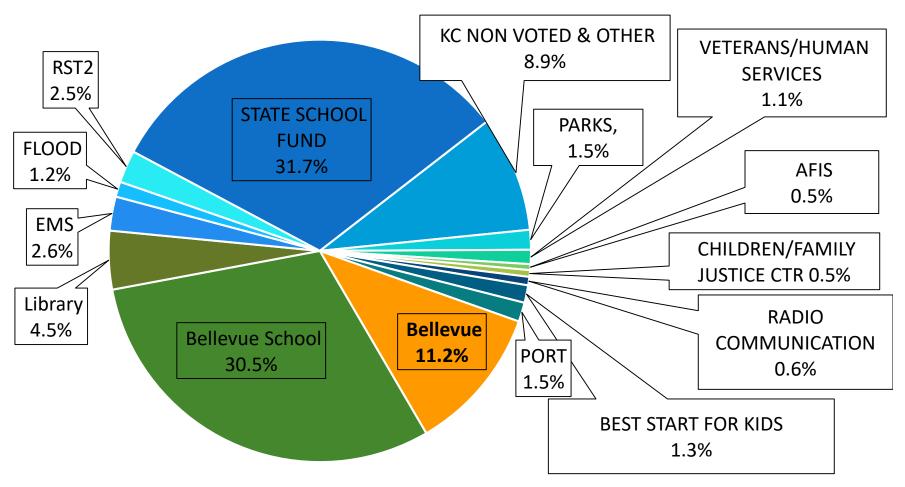


Total City Resources \$1.7B



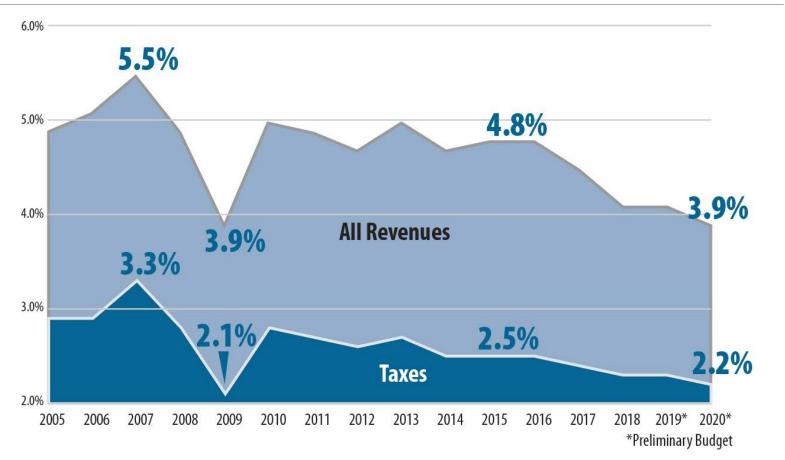


2018 Property Tax Distribution

2019-2020 GENERAL FUND BUDGET

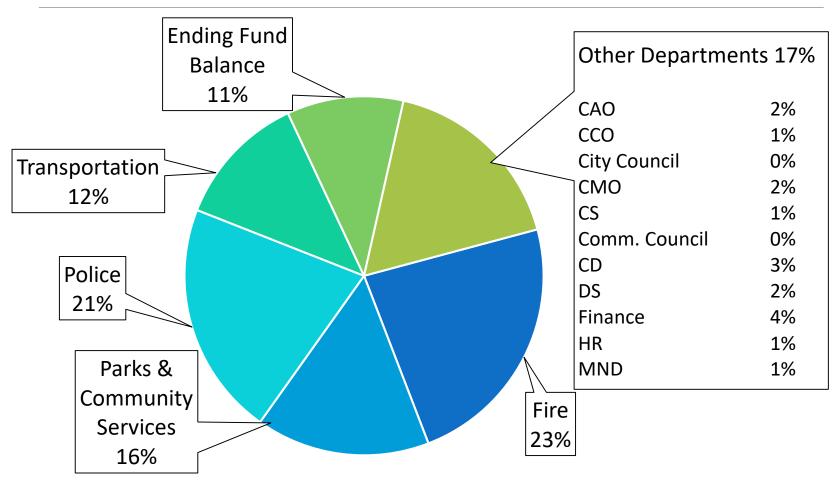


The General Fund

- •\$476 Million
- •8.1% Biennial Growth
- Supports many of the community direct facing services: Transportation, Parks, Fire, Police, Community Development
- •And most of the administrative support work including Finance, City Manager, City Council, City Attorney, et al.

New Investments

- Police to provide more patrol in community policing
- •Fire Inspectors to maintain bi-annual inspections supported by fire inspection fee
- Homelessness Outreach Coordinator
- LEOFF I impact starting in 2019
- Other increases offset by cost reductions or increased revenue



Strategies

- Impacting out year expenditure growth
 - Health care strategies
- Proposes 1% Property tax in 2019 and 1% in 2020
 - Estimated \$9.50 annually for a \$791,000 AV
 - 2019 estimated rate is \$0.92/\$1000 AV
- Proposes Fire Inspection Fee starting in 2020
 - Cost recovery for direct program costs similar to other inspections
 - Maintains current bi-annual inspections

2019-2025 CAPITAL INVESTMENT PLAN



Total Capital Investment Program

- General CIP
 - \$222M for 2 years
 - \$693M for 7 years
- Utilities CIP
 - •\$312M for 2 years (\$131M exp; \$181M reserves)
 - \$225M in expenditures for 7 years
 - Return on November 13



General CIP...

- Builds on the 2017-2023 CIP
- Advances the Council Priorities total of \$30 million
- Ensures debt obligations are met; TIFIA starts in 2024
- Maintains existing infrastructure in accordance with the council policy
- Promotes diversity and accessibility



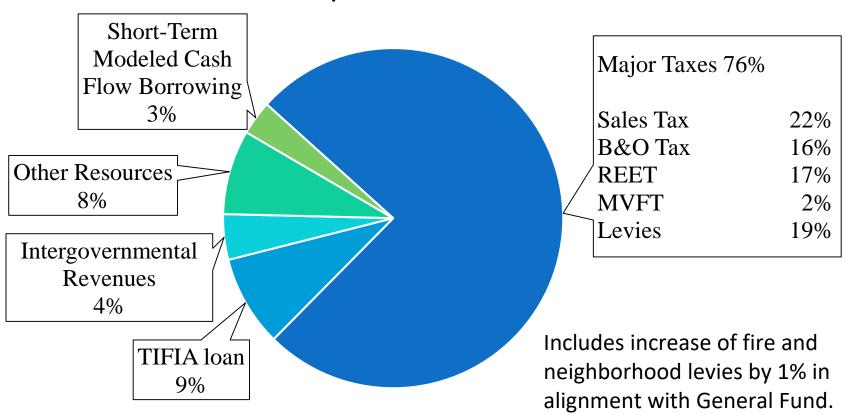
Cont....

- Continues voter approved levies
- Continues to show progress on large scale, long term projects
- •Fulfills general government capital responsibilities
- Supports neighborhood programs
- Provides quality of life amenities



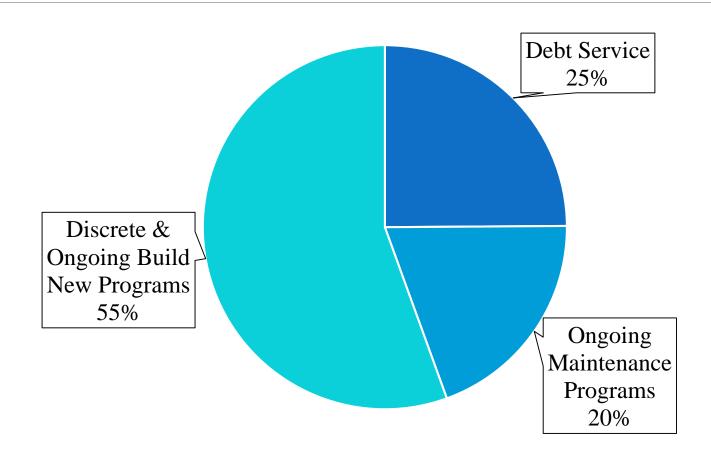
General Capital Investment Funds by Resource – 7 Year

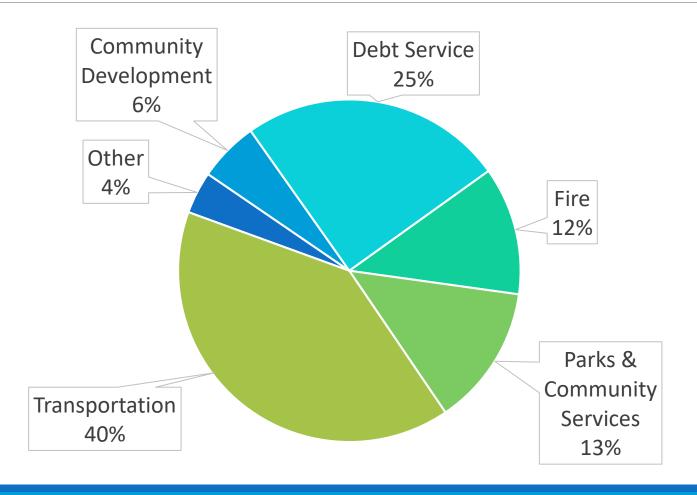


General Capital Investment Fund Expenditures by Category— 7 Year (\$693M)

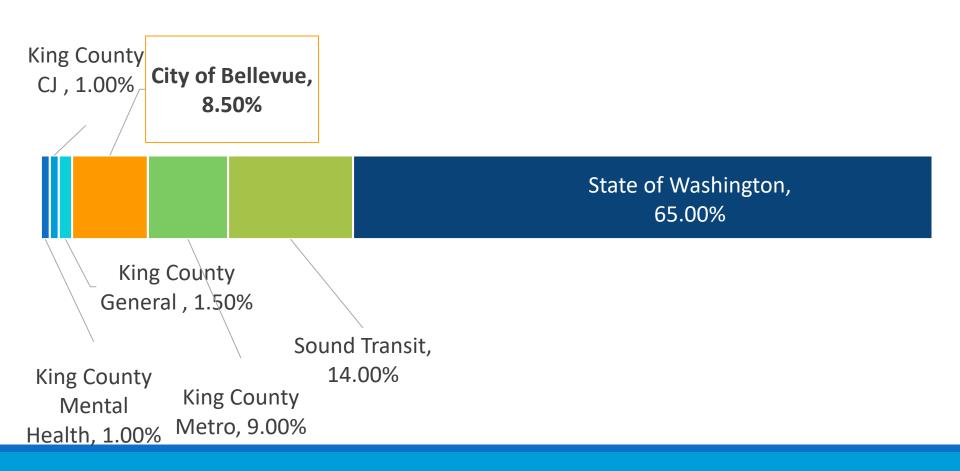
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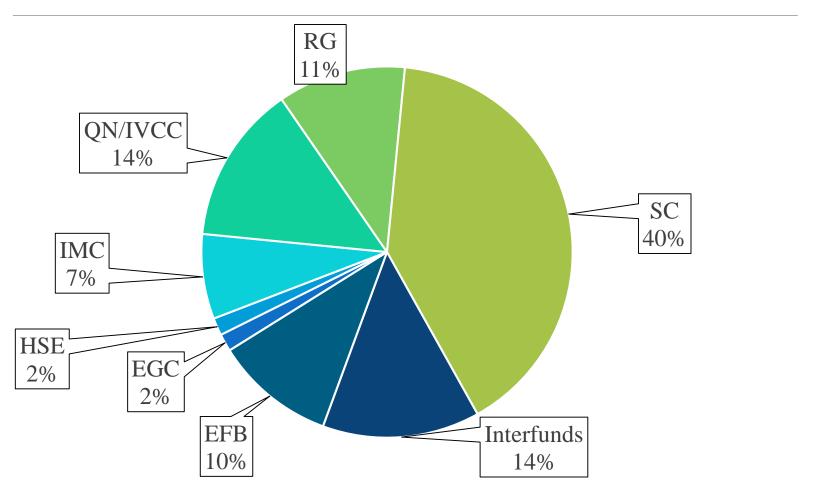


Sales Tax Distribution: Total Rate = 10% of Purchase
