









#### FRAMEWORK PLAN

  - High level visioning process
  - Does not include Interstate 405 crossing
- Presented to Council and released to the public June 2017
- Over 2,500 online views
- Emails to over 2,000 subscribers
- Comments focused on clarifying questions

  - Open houses with King County (Eastside Rail Corridor)



  - Begin design refinement of preferred alternative – Fall/Winter 2018







































### EMERGING VISION — ORGANIZING PRINCIPLES

- Transitions to Wilburton Hill Neighborhood and Park






#### EMERGING VISION — PARKS & OPEN SPACE

- Well designed pocket parks and plazas








