Why we are here

- NPDES Permit—Federal Clean Water Act
- NPDES Permit authorizes discharge of stormwater runoff into waters of the state
- NPDES Permit revised in August 2013—Bellevue must amend its codes by December 31, 2016—for new and redevelopment projects only
- Housekeeping and conformance amendments

NPDES Consistency Updates

- Non-discretionary
- Alignment of definitions and terms with the NPDES Permit and the Stormwater Management Manual for Western Washington (SWMMWW)
- Primarily related to erosion and sedimentation control (LID Principles Project)

Housekeeping and Conformance

- Discretionary, but necessary for effective implementation of mandatory requirements
- Consistency with other sections of the Clearing and Grading Code and other BCC provisions
- Efficient and predictable review for project applicants
- Housekeeping items

Conformance Updates Examples

- Excavation (23.76.030) includes removal of <u>soil</u>, <u>peat</u>, or <u>concrete</u>
- When a permit is required (23.76.035): <u>Construction or</u> reconstruction of rockeries; clearing of over 1,000 sf <u>within a</u> <u>1-year period</u>; removal of 5 significant trees within any 3year period
- Abatement security (23.76.140) for clearing of more than <u>250 cy</u>
