

K Line Overview



Benefits:

- Serves fast-growing communities between Eastgate, downtown Bellevue, and Totem Lake
- Helps ease congestion and improve air quality
- Multimodal access
- Supports the Bellevue Transit Master Plan and "Abundant Access" vision statement

Status:

Preliminary Design

Began in September 2019







Integrated Transit Network

- Supports higher demand for transit
- Connects riders to high capacity transit options
 - RapidRide B Line (existing)
 - Sound Transit's Link light rail Blue Line (2023)
 - I-405 Bus Rapid Transit (2024)
 - RapidRide K Line (2025)
- Complementary service restructures
 - Coordination with Sound Transit, partners, stakeholders and riders
- Reflects Bellevue's goals for transit
 - Convenient
 - Frequent
 - Efficient



Bellevue College Connector





Partnership project between City of Bellevue, Bellevue College, and King County Metro

- More direct transit pathway
- Significantly faster travel time
- Funding identified to study project, but additional funding needed to complete design and construction

Status:

City, College, and Metro working on agreement to advance study of project

- Travel times and potential time savings
- Equity and social justice
- Destinations and activity centers served
- Network considerations
- Projected future ridership
- Community engagement
 - Community survey, events, briefings (November)






Preliminary Design Timeline
