#### Planning Commission Recommendation November 10, 2014

- Interim Regulations
- Two Recommended Enhancements:
  - Administrative Conditional Use Process; and
  - Including additional Parks for Separation from Recreational Marijuana Uses

## Administrative Conditional Use

- Provides Notice to Property Owners within 500 feet radius
- Allows for public comment
- Allows City to impose conditions for unanticipated impacts
- Provides opportunity for administrative appeal

### **Additional Parks**

- Requires 1,000 foot separation from all parks mapped in the City's GIS system – not just public parks
- These parks are typically located in singlefamily neighborhoods where recreational marijuana uses are not allowed

## Summary of Recommendation

- Amends Use charts (General and Bel-Red) to include Recreational Marijuana Uses
- Adds New Requirements for Marijuana Uses (LUC 20.20.535)
  - Purpose and Applicability
  - Administrative Conditional Use Review\*
  - Specific Definitions
  - Separation Requirements\*
  - Performance Standards for all Uses including Controlling Odor
  - Additional Security Provisions
    \*PC Enhancements

### 2015 State Legislation

- The Cannabis Patient Protection Act (2SSB 5052)
  - Reconciles medical and recreational marijuana programs – focus on medical marijuana
  - LCB to develop rules and licensing for medical marijuana producers, processors, & retailers
  - LCB also to reevaluate the number of stores/producers/processors and issue more licenses to support medical marijuana
  - Rules for minors use of medical marijuana

# 2015 State Legislation, Continued (2SSB 5052)

- Prohibits collective gardens on July 1, 2016
- Allows medical cooperatives beginning July 1 2016
  - Limited to **4 patients**, and may include the designated provider for a minor.
  - 60-day waiting period before a new member may join after a member leaves.
  - May not be located **within one mile** of a marijuana retailer.
  - Must be located in the domicile of a member and only one cooperative per property tax parcel.
- LCB or law enforcement may inspect a cooperative

# 2015 State Legislation, Continued (2SSB 5052) Personal Grows

- Qualified patients may grow medical marijuana in their homes – only indoor
- Cannot grow where marijuana can be readily seen by unaided vision or readily smelled from a public place or the private property of another housing unit.
- Allowed number of plants depends on if patient is registered in the voluntary database.
- Unregistered patients up to 4 plants and 6 oz. of medical marijuana
- Registered patients up to 6 plants and 8 oz. of medical marijuana

### 2015 State Legislation (SB 5121)

- Authorizes LCB to license marijuana research
- Produce and process marijuana for limited research purposes
- New marijuana use
- Council direction sought on how to address this new use until LCB develops regulatory program

#### 2015 State Legislation (2E2SHB 2136)

- Revenue sharing bill.
- Separation requirements for marijuana research premises.
- Allows reduction of separation distances from 1,000 feet down to 100 feet except for elementary and secondary schools and playgrounds.
- Allow jurisdictions to prohibit the siting of marijuana cooperatives.

### Next Steps

- Pending Council direction return on July 20 for final action
- Present adopted ordinance at the East Bellevue Community Council for final public hearing and action on August 4 2015; or
- Undertake alternative action consistent with Council direction
