## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

This Motion will award Bid No. 19102 to NPM Construction Co. to replace five signal poles at three intersections.

### RECOMMENDATION

Move to award Bid No. 19102 for 2019 Signal Pole Replacements to NPM Construction Co.

### **BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS**

This project will install five new signal poles at three locations: 148<sup>th</sup> Avenue SE and SE 16<sup>th</sup> Street; 148<sup>th</sup> Avenue SE and SE 22<sup>nd</sup> Street; and, Richards Road and SE 26<sup>th</sup> Street. The new signal poles will allow for protected-permissive left turn movements with flashing yellow arrows in the east-west direction at the intersections. The protected-permissive operation will reduce delays and queuing at these intersections.

This project is fully funded by the Neighborhood Safety, Connectivity and Congestion Levy approved by voters in November 2016. The Neighborhood Safety and Connectivity component (CIP Plan PW-R-199) of the Levy funds five project types including safety, sidewalks, bicycle facilities, intelligent transportation systems and maintenance.

All claims are rigorously reviewed and only those that are clearly necessary to accomplish the intent of the contract, but have not previously been provided for, will be paid.

The contract is fully funded in the 2019-2025 Capital Investment Program (CIP) through the Neighborhood Safety and Connectivity (Levy) project (CIP Plan No. PW-R-199).

- 2. Award the bid to the next lowest bidder if the low bidder is not responsive.
- 3. Reject all bids and provide alternative direction to staff.
