




#### Background What this LUCA is not

#### LUC 20.30U does not regulate:

- Unlawful camping on public property such as in parks, public right of way, etc.
- Parking or sleeping overnight in vehicles.
- Temporary or permanent shelters for persons experiencing homelessness

# Stakeholder Feedback

Original Signatories and Neighborhood Focus Group



### **Encampment Host Feedback**

- Tent cities are necessary and have a right to exist.
- The Consent Decree and 20.30U are outdated.
- Simplification of the permitting process for religious institutions who have hosted previously.
- Tent cities should be managed consistently throughout the region.



## Neighborhood Group Feedback

- Increase accountability for encampment hosts and operators.
- Seek alignments between Consent Decree and 20.30U.
- Incorporate best practices learned from previous hostings.
- Bellevue based solution for temporary encampments.
- Create flexibility for hosts who are committed to working with the adjacent neighborhood.

## Alignment of Health and Safety Standards to the Consent Decree

#### **Experience:**

- 13+ years of operating in this manner
- Success in preventing disease and protecting public health
- Better reflect practical realities that exist on temporary encampment sites (e.g. showers available, water supply)

**Staff Recommendation:** Amend health and safety standards to reflect operations under Consent Decree



## Neighborhood Engagement

#### Staff recommendations:

- Remove litter requirement from the LUC
- Establish Optional Post-Issuance Informational Meeting Between encampment host and neighborhood
  - Director discretion to require meeting



## **Duration and Frequency**

#### Duration

- Current Framework: 90 days
- Staff Recommendation: 120 days

#### Frequency

- Current Framework:
  - 18-month gap between deployments to the same site.
  - Limits deployments to one per calendar year.
  - Minimum 180-day gap between deployments to the City
- **Staff Recommendation:** Consolidate site-specific and Citywide requirements to a 12-month gap between deployments in the City

Application Encampment Management Responsibility Plan

- Description of Security Measures
- Insurance information
- Exemptions sought (e.g. hardship)
- Transportation Plan
- Proposed site plan
- Street address

Meet and confer with Bellevue Police Department

Meet and confer with schools/day cares

Public meeting

Mailed and signed notice of application

## **Streamlined Permit Process**

#### **Subsequent Year Application Requirements**

#### ESTIMATED PROCESS TIME: 60 DAYS

#### (for no change, minor modifications)

Courtesy letter to neighbors Description of proposal Arrival / departure dates Identification of any modification to previous approval Safety and Security Report Periodic Operation Reports
