Maintenance Management Plans What Are They?

- Plans used to create budgets and manage maintenance workloads
- Inventory of property and assets
- Identifies labor, equipment and materials for safe and effective site maintenance
- Provide systematic and consistent approach based on national standards

Maintenance Management Plans How Are They Developed?

- Inventory of Assets
- Policies, Goals and Objectives
- Site Specific Inventory
- Maintenance Tasks and Frequencies
- Annual Workload Plans
- Annual Renovation Plan

Maintenance Management Plans System Wide Asset Inventory

- Land
 - ➤ Developed Parks approx. 800 Acres
 - > 22 Community/Beach Parks
 - ➤ 59 Neighborhood Parks
 - > 29 Athletic Fields
 - ▶ 2 Golf Courses
 - ➤ Natural Areas >1,900 acres
 - ➤ Streetscapes > 200 acres (>10,000 trees)
 - > Trails approx. 98 Miles
- Building/Picnic Shelters/Restrooms
 - > 117 Buildings totaling > 360,000 ft²
 - > 48 Playgrounds
 - > 4 Skate Parks

Maintenance Management Plans Site Specific Asset Inventory

- Buildings and other Structural Facilities
- Formal Turf Areas
- Trees and Landscaped Beds
- Sports Fields
- Natural Areas
- Irrigation Systems
- Hard Surfaces Parking lots, Sidewalks
- Trails, Pathways, Bridges and Boardwalks

Maintenance Management Plans Workload Plans

- Develop Workload Plans for Each Site/Asset
 - Quantity what is the quantity of the asset managed
 - Unit of Measure what unit of measure will be used
 - Tasks what tasks are needed to maintain the asset
 - Time Standard how long does it take to perform tasks (field verified national standards)
 - Frequency what frequency will tasks be performed (daily, weekly, monthly)
 - Task + Time Standard + Frequency = <u>Annual Workload</u><u>Plan</u>
