A Neighborhood Area Plans are one way the city supports strong neighborhood. Neighborhood Plans serve as a roadmap to the future. They provide residents, businesses, city staff and other stakeholders with guidance as each neighborhood grows and changes over time.

Each Neighborhood Area Plan is based on a template that includes:

- A vision statement that reflects the community's core values;
- A community profile that examines current conditions and trends;
- An examination of key opportunities and challenges;
- Policies to guide future development;
- A list of community identified goals and actions.

The **Great Neighborhoods** program is the process for developing these plans. Using online and in-person tools, events, activities, and more we'll be working with residents and stakeholders to develop plans that secure our neighborhoods' future as livable, inspiring, vibrant, and equitable communities.

Content – roadmap that addresses resilience, identity, safety, walking/biking and other emerging issues

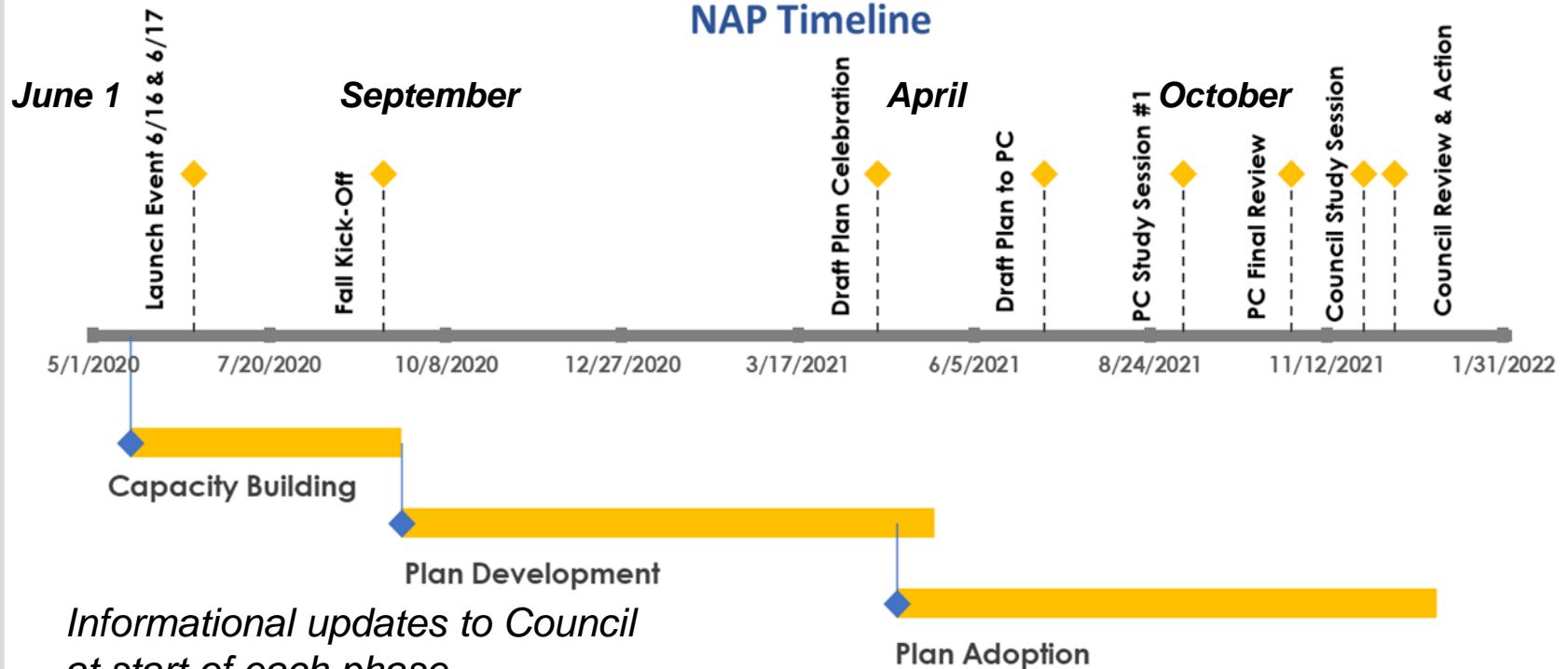
