






TFP Purpose—Capital Needs & Planning Framework

Status of Current TFP Projects

51 projects in current, 2019-2030 TFP

- 40 projects with funding allocations
- 11 candidate projects in the PBII reserve

11 of the projects with funding allocations will be completed or under construction by end of 2021.

Five PBII candidate projects due to be completed or have elements under construction by end of 2021.

19 projects listed with "placeholder" funding.

"Reserve" allocations – funding for priority,

- pedestrian & bicycle projects ("PBII")
- transit infrastructure improvements
- congestion levy projects
