

Feedback & Discussion Three Open Houses

- Updated WA State Energy Code
 - Significant concern from single-family builders
 - Also impacts commercial & multi-family
 - Single-family exterior electrical disconnect
 - High-rise firefighter air replenishment systems
 - High-rise use of 3rd stair for egress
 - High-rise pressurized elevator hoist ways

Significant Changes to the International Codes



- Increased seismic ground motion due to research findings (Model Code)
- Incorporation of seismic basin effects (WA State Code)
- Wood buildings now allowed for high-rise up to 18 stories (Model Code)
- Escape/rescue opening no longer required in basement sleeping rooms equipped with fire sprinkler system (Model Code)
- Smoke detectors in existing areas may use wireless technology to achieve interconnection (Model Code)
- Fire sprinklers required for townhouses with 5 or more attached units (WA State Code)

Significant Changes to the State Energy Code



Residential:

- Electrical readiness for gas water heaters and dryers
- Energy efficiency requirements increasing


Commercial:

- Allowable air leakage rate reduced
- Solar readiness for 40% of roof areas for buildings less than 20 stories


Significant Changes - Electrical



- Surge protection
- Exterior service disconnect



All one- and two-family dwelling unit service conductors shall terminate in disconnecting means having a short-circuit current rating equal to or greater than the available fault current, installed in a **readily accessible outdoor location**





Proposed Bellevue City Code Amendments





- Abatement of Dangerous Buildings Code
 - Incorporated into new Chapter 23.20 BCC
- Uniform Housing Code
 - Incorporated into new Chapter 23.22 BCC

1997 Abatement of Dangerous Buildings Code

Purpose of Abatement of Dangerous Buildings Code:

- Mechanism to require repair, vacation, or demolition of dangerous buildings which endanger life, health, property, safety or welfare
- The provisions of this code apply to all dangerous buildings as defined in this code

Amendment includes:

- Incorporation of the 1997 Abatement of Dangerous Buildings Code into the BCC as a new Chapter 23.20
- Clarifying/consistency with BCC structure
- No substantive changes

1997 Uniform Housing Code

Purpose of Uniform Housing Code:

- Provide minimum standards to safeguard life, health, property, and public welfare
- Regulate the use and occupancy, and maintenance of buildings

Amendment includes:

- Incorporation of 1997 Uniform Housing Code into the BCC as a new Chapter 23.22
- Clarifying/consistency with BCC structure
- No substantive changes

- On-demand mobile fueling
- Mobile food trucks










Significant <u>Proposed</u> Fire Code Amendments

Implementation Date?

- State Law mandates:
 - Electrical code effective 10/29/2020
 - Construction and fire codes effective 02/01/2021
- Staff are requesting the following code provisions be enacted October 29, 2020:
 - Revisions to Fire Inspection Fees (IFC 106)
 - Revisions to In-Building Radio Systems (IFC 510)
 - Elevator Maintenance (IFC 609)
 - Revisions to Firefighter Air Systems (IFC 919)
 - National Electrical Code (per state mandate)



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
