## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

This Motion will award Bid No. 20061 to Kamins Construction for the NE 12<sup>th</sup> Street Multipurpose Path – 108<sup>th</sup> Avenue NE to 112<sup>th</sup> Avenue NE.

### RECOMMENDATION

Move to award Bid No. 20061 for the NE 12th Street Multipurpose Path – 108<sup>th</sup> Avenue NE to 112<sup>th</sup> Avenue NE to Kamins Construction.

#### **BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS**

The NE 12<sup>th</sup> Street multipurpose path will replace the existing 5-foot wide concrete sidewalk with a 12-foot wide concrete multipurpose path with 4-foot wide minimum planter strip between 108<sup>th</sup> Avenue NE and 112<sup>th</sup> Avenue NE. The project also includes upgrades to ADA ramps, traffic signal system improvements, and landscaping and irrigation improvements along the south side of McCormick Park.

This project extends the existing multipurpose path from 112<sup>th</sup> Avenue NE westward to 108<sup>th</sup> Avenue NE where it will connect to protected bicycle lanes. This multipurpose path will be the primary non-motorized connection between the heart of Downtown and the Spring District. This is a segment of the Downtown-Overlake priority bicycle corridor as identified in the Pedestrian and Bicycle Transportation Plan (2009) and is also documented in the Downtown Transportation Plan (2015).

In order to maximize efficiency and reduce overall costs to the City, this project is collaborating with the Overlay Program to remove the existing cement concrete pedestrian bridge approach slabs and foundation. The bridge was removed in 2019. This work is funded by the Overlay Program (CIP Plan No. M-1).

#### Fiscal Impact

Awarding this bid will obligate the City to \$761,755.58, plus all applicable taxes, to construct a 12-foot wide cement concrete multipurpose path on NE 12<sup>th</sup> Street between 108<sup>th</sup> Avenue NE and 112<sup>th</sup> Avenue NE. This amount is approximately 24 percent under the Engineer's Estimate, due to very favorable current bidding climate. Sufficient funding exists in the 2019-2025 CIP (CIP Plan Nos. PW-R-182 and PW-M-1) to fully fund this contract as follows:

- 1. Award Bid No. 20061, NE 12<sup>th</sup> Street Multipurpose Path 108<sup>th</sup> Avenue NE to 112<sup>th</sup> Avenue NE (CIP Plan Nos. PW-R-182 and PW-M-1) to Kamins Construction as the lowest responsible and responsive bidder, in the amount of \$761,755.58 plus all applicable taxes.
- 2. Award the bid to the next lowest bidder if the low bidder is not responsive.
- 3. Reject all bids and provide alternative direction to staff.
