



  - Has reliability and coverage to handle all types of emergencies or disasters.
- Project leadership is in involved with / leads key national organizations keeping an eye on future technologies.
- Project team will pass on system capabilities and industry knowledge to future PSERN Operator staff, including:
  - tracking progress of FirstNet and Department of Homeland Security Science and Technology Directorate work with first responders.
  - System security reviews and technologies.
