



PCS Comment/Recommendation for Framework Plan 2018: Keep the Grand Connection grand--

COB Response

provide a significant public park for the GC's east side

Best addressed through Wilburton code and policy process and I-405 lid feasibility study

2017: GC should maintain own cohesive and unique sense of place and identity...the Natural Landscape be the primary identity and character for the route

Guidelines/standards include supporting language related to a strong ecological framework and the use of a signature color on furnishings and bike racks to support a sense of cohesion

2017: Ideas for implementing programming should be more fully explored....including:

- Interpretation of the city's history and heritage
- Celebration of cultural diversity and inclusion
- Community gathering opportunities and events

Guidelines/standards include supporting language adapted from the 2017 Grand Connection Arts and Culture Plan

2017: Reach out to embrace other amenities north and south including: Lake to Lake Greenway Trail and Eastside Rail Corridor (Eastrail)

Sequence One route merges with Lake to Lake trail in Old Bellevue, and Sequence Two terminates at the Eastrail in Wilburton


Grand Connection Framework Plan (Sequences One and Two)

- Functions as the high-level vision
- Further study almost always needed
- Non-regulatory
- Multiple tools for implementation



Grand Connection Sequence One Guidelines and Standards

- Refresh of Pedestrian Corridor and Major Public Open Space Guidelines
- Single tool (of many) for implementation
- Deals with language in Downtown Code (regulatory)
- Supports standards/guidelines projects located along Sequence One

Step 1: Audit Existing Content/Precedents

Step 2: Reduce redundancies/incorporate outreach and best practice recommendations

Step 3: Merge stand-alone content into body of Downtown Land Use Code (LUC)

Step 4: Create new Grand Connection section in Downtown LUC for easy reference









NE 6th portion sits within existing Pedestrian Corridor dimensions








- Illustrates how design guidelines and standards could be achieved
- Allows for quick reference by design teams




What They Aren't

- Suggestive of what the designs should look like


DRAFT Transit Central Diagram




DRAFT Garden Hillclimb Diagram
