## **Bellevue Botanical Garden Society**

The Society was founded in 1984 to support the City's efforts to create the Bellevue Botanical Garden. The 1,600-member Society is governed by a volunteer board of directors. Its mission is to perpetuate and further enhance the Garden as a learning resource in partnership with the City of Bellevue.

## **Bellevue Botanical Garden Governance**

The Garden was created in partnership and has operated in the partnership model without interruption since its inception. All major operational and development decisions at the Garden are determined by the Coordinating Committee, with representation from the City and the Society.
