# **BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS**

Formed in 2009 as a non-profit corporation, NORCOM serves as the regional emergency dispatch center for the Eastside of King County all the way to the Kittitas County border. Fourteen fire and medical agencies and six police agencies are member jurisdictions, including both fire and police services of the City of Bellevue.

NORCOM is led by an executive director who is responsible for its entire success, including strategy, culture, and technical execution. The executive director reports to a governing board comprised of one delegate from each member jurisdiction. Delegates are professional executives, which include city managers, police administrators, and fire and emergency medical administrators. The delegate for the City of Bellevue is Deputy City Manager Nathan McCommon and the alternate is Fire Chief Jay Hagen.
