Bellevue; and

Whereas: Knowledge and skills are important in reducing human error and improving judgment,

allowing boaters to take precautionary measures to protect themselves and their friends

and family; and

Whereas: Failing to follow nautical rules, using drugs or alcohol while controlling a boat or choosing

not to wear a life vest add significant risks; and

Whereas: In 2019, there were 106 boating-related accidents in Washington state, resulting in 27

deaths and 55 injuries; and

Whereas: The proper equipment such as life jackets and preparedness like checking the weather saves

lives; and

Whereas: The U.S. Coast Guard and U.S. Power Squadron are invested in the well-being of the

community and will check vessels for safety.

Now, therefore, I, Lynne Robinson, Mayor of the City of Bellevue, Washington, and on behalf of its City

Council, do hereby proclaim the week of May 22-28, 2021 as:

NATIONAL SAFE BOATING AND PADDLING WEEK

and urge all citizens to practice year-round safe boating practices, and to "Boat Smart – Boat Safe – and Wear It."
