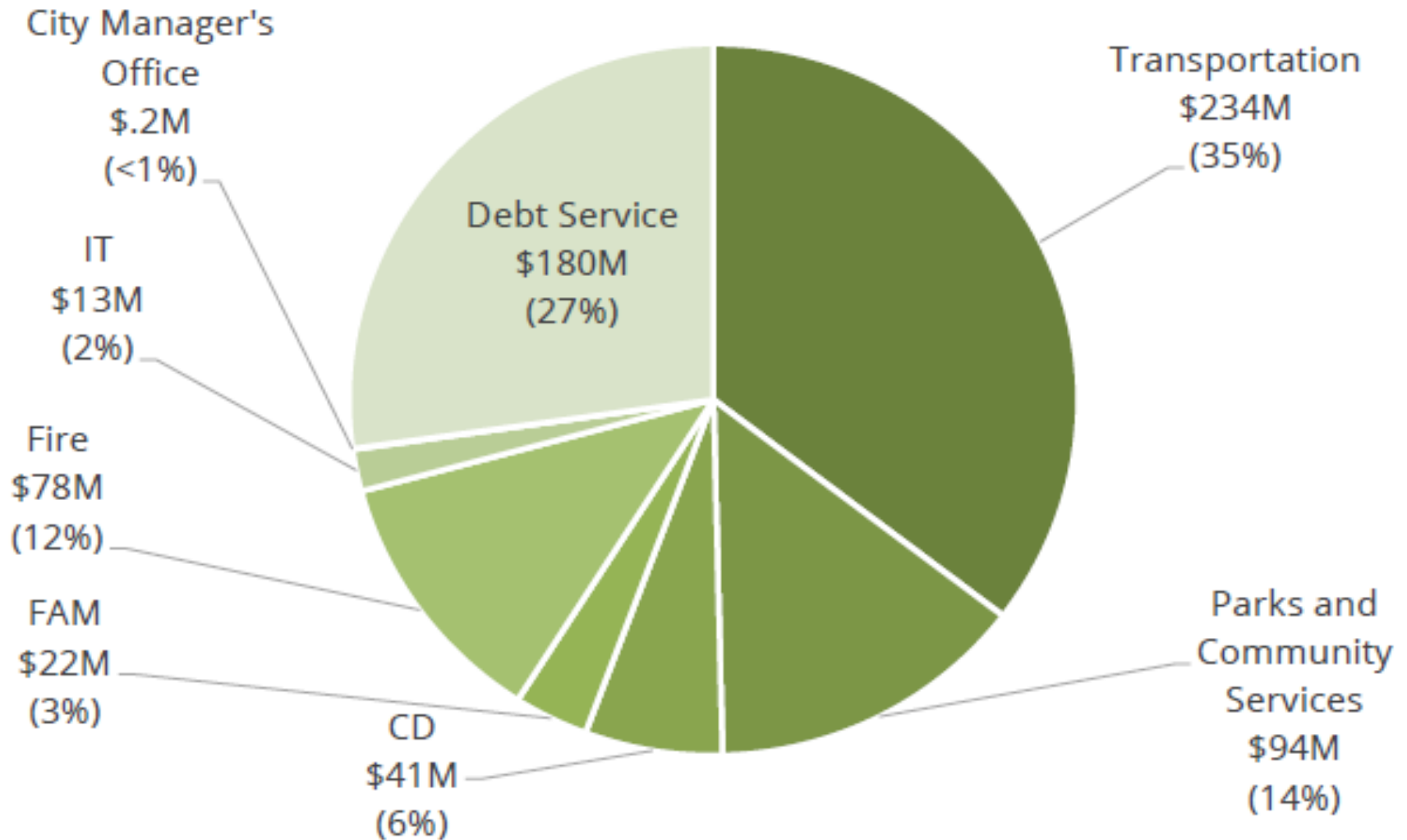

- Established inter-agency working group
- Lower traffic volumes assisted work efforts and helped reduce costs
- Minimal project delay issues

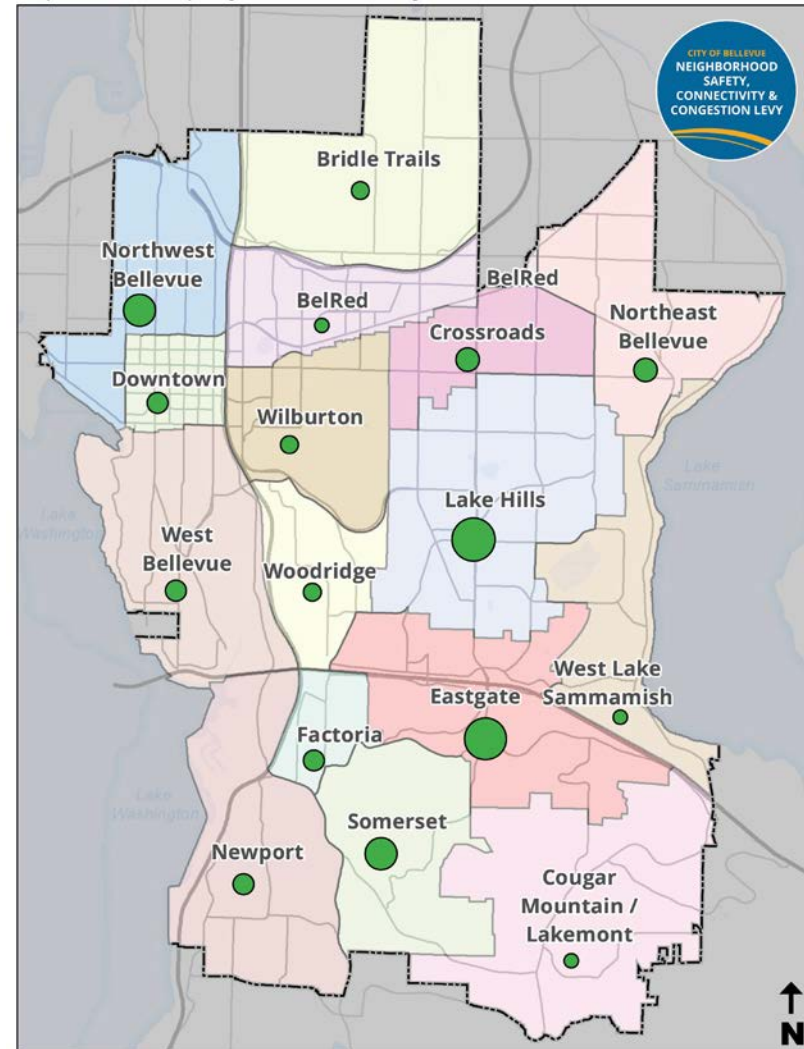

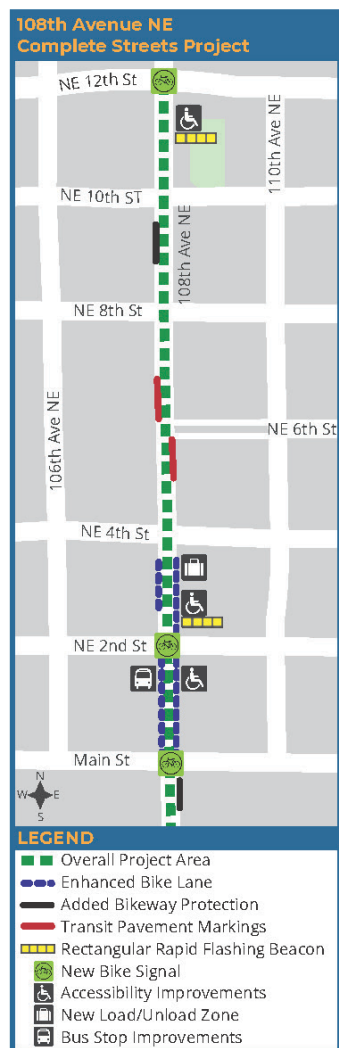

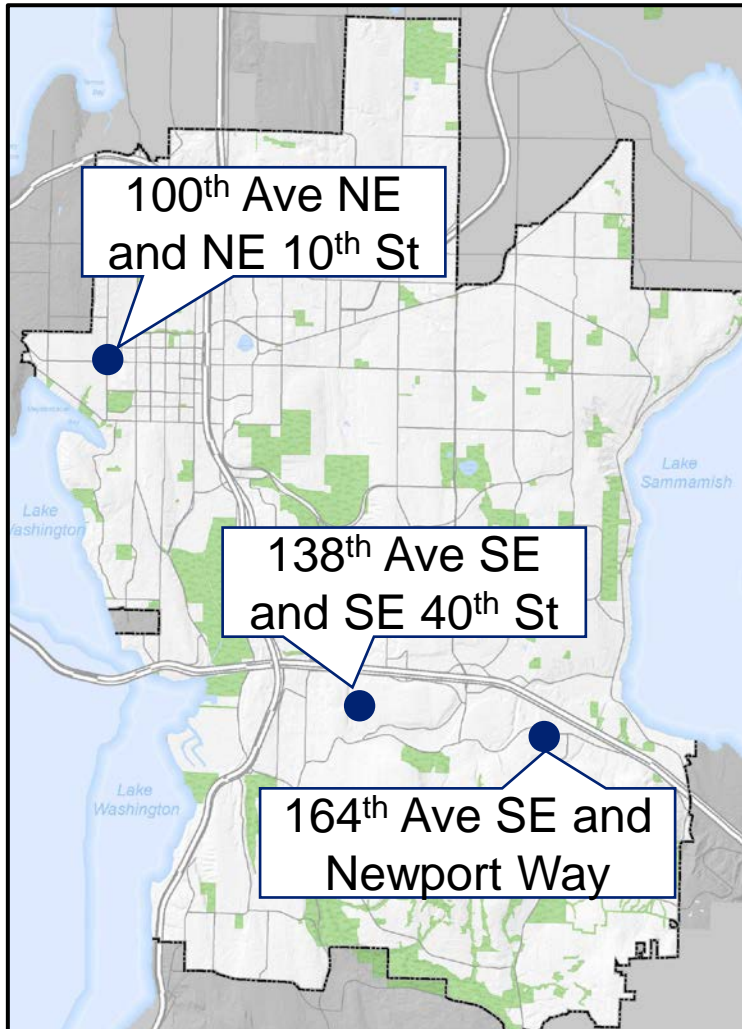

Mini Roundabouts



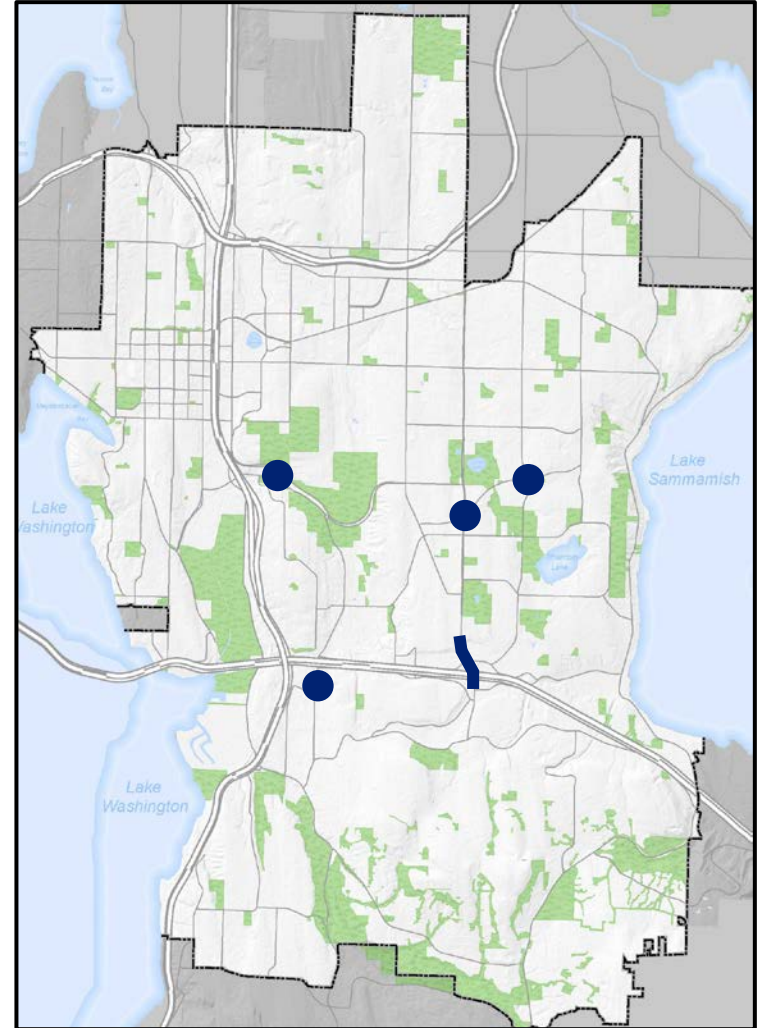
- First three mini roundabouts in city

- Room for large vehicles



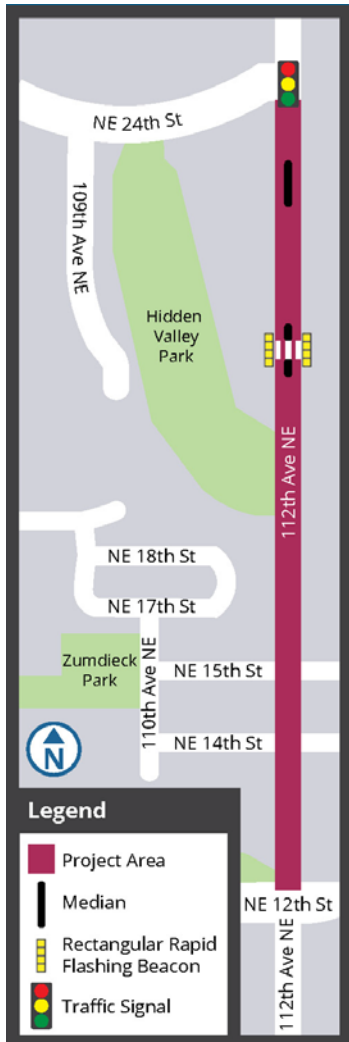
100th Ave NE and NE 10th St

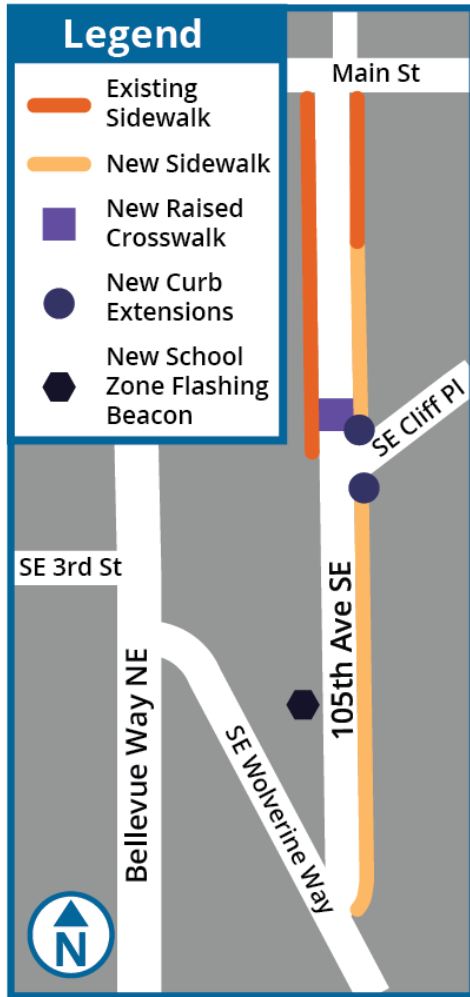

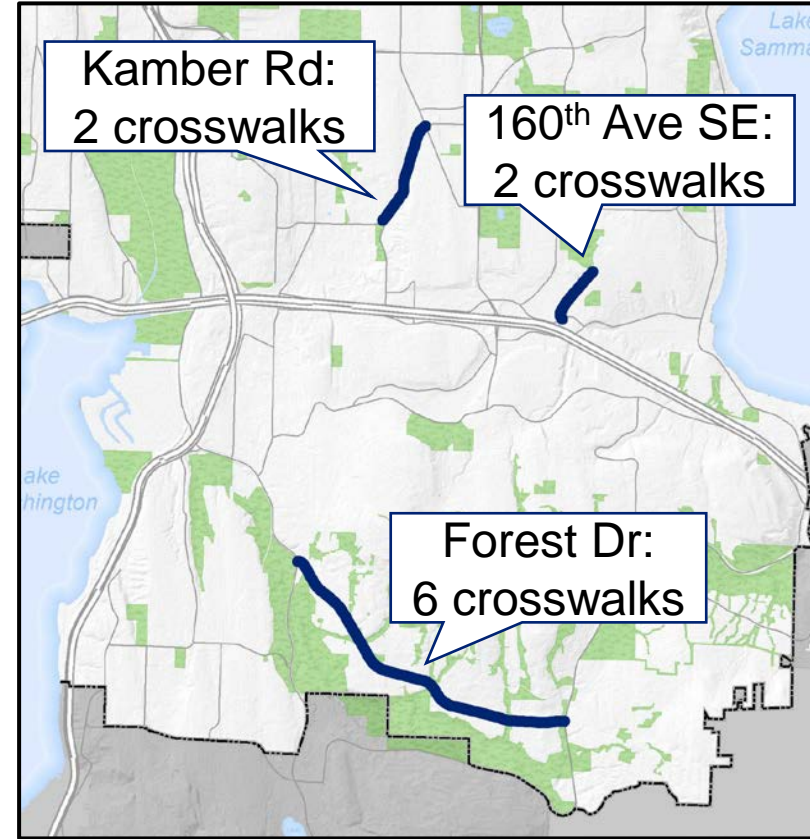

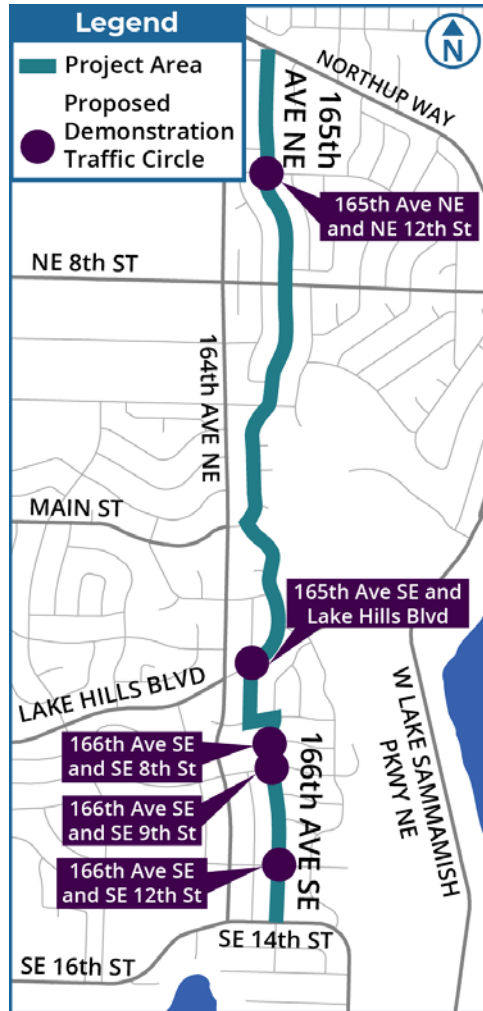

On the horizon

- Safe Routes to School Grant in Northwest Bellevue
- More projects in the pipeline
- Keeping the community informed
 - Mailers
 - Progress report
 - Signing



The City of Bellevue Transportation Department is planning the following safety improvements along 112th Avenue NE, between NE 12th Street and NE 24th Street:

- **Sidewalk access:** Closures are needed for repair work; however, access will be maintained on the opposite side.
- **Tree removal/replanting:** Due to hazardous conditions, approximately 60 trees along the sidewalk within the project area will be removed to avoid future problems with sidewalk heaving. As mitigation, 100 new trees will be planted in a designated area at Hidden Valley Sports Park.
