








COVID-19 : Construction Impacts

- Early Direction/Guidance Helped!
- Modification of permit conditions and contractor assistance provided safe work environment.
- Established inter-agency working group
- Lower traffic volumes assisted work efforts and helped reduce costs
- Minimal project delay issues

- Project pipeline is robust






108th Ave NE Complete Streets Project



Mini Roundabouts




- First three mini roundabouts in city


