religion and sexual orientation. This program significantly

strengthened relationships with Bellevue's diverse communities and

improved accessibility and communications with residents and

businesses; and

**Whereas:** Through his tenure, the Chief continuously challenged systems within

the police department and instituted changes, where necessary, to ensure the Bellevue Police Department was providing the best service

possible; and

Whereas: During his time, Chief Mylett elevated employee wellness and

recognition to a top priority. This included quarterly and yearly awards presentations recognizing outstanding employee service. The Chief also created a new employee wellness program, assigning a sergeant to oversee the unit, giving staff access to critical health and financial

information; and

Whereas: Chief Mylett also helped navigate the police department and the City of

Bellevue's engagement in the social justice movement over the past year. The programs referenced above allowed for open dialogue and

swift participation in these critical issues.
