- **\$2.5 M** investment from Facebook, REI, and Kaiser Permanente



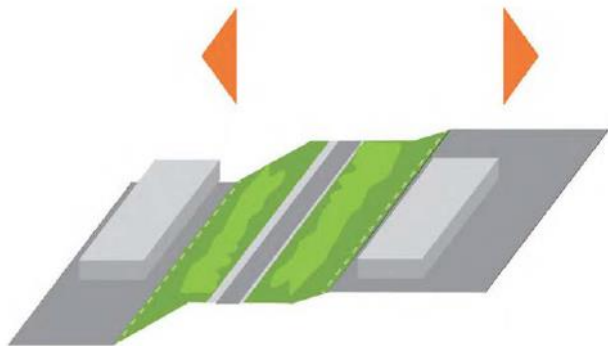

Opportunity to Engage at Edge

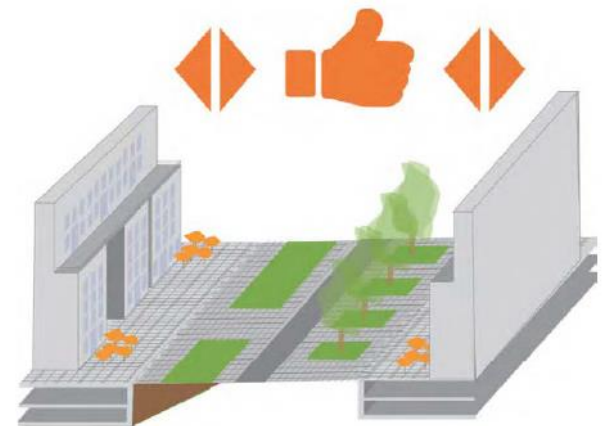


Typical regional trail design

A typical trail will not meet community or Eastrail goals in a redeveloped Wilburton.



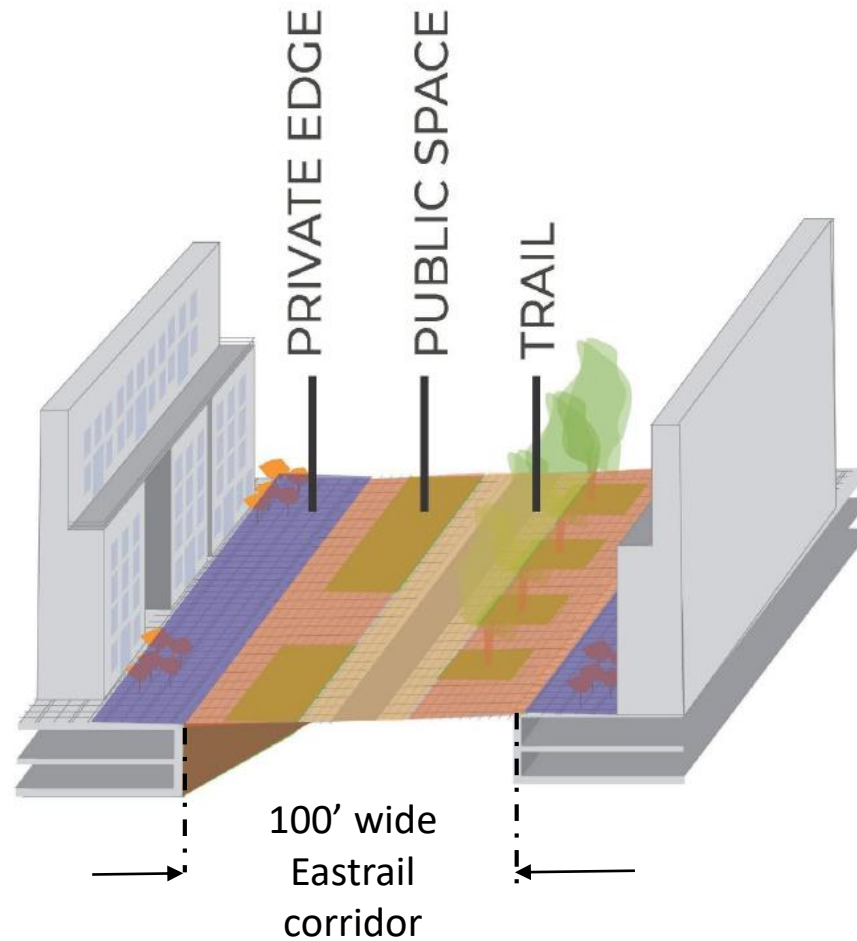
