## Thursday, January 25th

- Opening activities
- Individual councilmembers shared a leadership value important to them in their work on the council.
- The council clarified agreements for how they work together as councilmembers, building on work the council did at 2023 retreat. What's working well? Councilmembers discussed items that needed clarity or were missing.
- The council discussed the pros and cons of changing the council's meeting day and frequency.
- The council discussed annual travel planning and identified some next steps for staff to collect data and come back with recommendations.

- Staff provided an overview of 2023 accomplishments, and a look forward at 2024 and policy issues that are expected to come to the council.
- The council affirmed their directional alignment with regard to their current vision. A small sub-team of councilmembers will review the detailed language in the vision statement and come back with a recommendation on potential future changes.
- Staff introduced the new strategic target areas. After discussion and clarification, the council worked in small teams to identify modifications to the target areas. Staff to incorporate the modifications and return documents to council for review.
- Staff introduced proposed budget themes for tomorrow's discussion.
- Closing evaluation of the day, review decisions and action items.
